Macarthur School Fund-Boost

I am happy to announce that 10 schools in Macarthur will benefit from a share of \$32 million in grants to upgrade school infrastructure and equipment.

or building new outdoor learning spaces. The schools receiving funding are:

Pay rise for Aged Care workers!

I entered politics to provide a voice for our community, especially for those who struggle to have their voices heard. That is why I am very proud that **more than 250,000 aged care workers will receive a 15% pay increase** as part of our Budget.

This means that a:

Registered nurse on a level 2.3 award wage will be paid an additional \$196.08 a week (more than \$10,000 a year)

- ➤ An enrolled nurse on a level 2 award wage will be paid an additional \$145.54 a week (more than \$7500 a year)
- An assistant in nursing on a level 3 award wage will be paid an additional \$136.68 a week (more than \$7100 a year)
- ► A personal care worker on a level 4 (aged care award) or a home care worker on a level 3.1 (SCHADS award) will be paid an additional \$141.10 a week (more

than \$7300 a year)

- ► A recreational activity officer on a level 3 (aged care award) will be paid an additional \$139.54 a week (more than \$7200 a year)
- ► A head chef/cook on a level 4 (aged care award) will be paid an additional \$141.12 a week (more than \$7300 a year)
- A staff member with a Certificate III qualification moves from earning only \$940 per week to \$1,082

Long COVID Inquiry

As the Chair for the Standing Committee on Health, Aged Care and Sport, I was very proud to have our Long COVID Inquiry report, titled Sick and tired: Casting a long shadow, finished and published

This report will shape our national approach to Long COVID and repeated COVID infections and I thank all Committee members, the secretariat and those who made submissions for making this possible. We received over 560 submissions, which ranged from those suffering from Long COVID to those researching it.

I am thankful also to the Minister for Health and Aged Care, the Hon. Mark Butler MP, for his support, interest, and guidance

throughout this inquiry. Following the publication of our report, Minister Butler announced that \$50 million from the Medical Research Future Fund (MRFF) will be provided for research into Long COVID.

This funding will help improve our

knowledge of Long COVID in the Australian context and generate evidence to inform policy and clinical guidance, improve health outcomes, and increase awareness in our community.

Importance of early education



Who doesn't love story time? Minister Aly and I gained a few friends during our visit to Macarthur early education centres.

Our fantastic Minister for Early Education, Anne Aly MP, visited Macarthur recently and we met with the staff and children of Goodstart Early Learning in Willowdale.

From 1 July 2023, approximately 96% of all families in Australia with a child in early education and care will benefit from our more affordable early learning and care policy.

This will benefit 9200 Macarthur families, and is another way that we are delivering cost of living relief whilst also boosting productivity in our community.

BUDGET

I am very proud to be part of an Albanese Government that is working hard for Macarthur.

Some big wins include:

- The largest ever investment in Medicare for bulkbilling, which benefits over 103,000 Macarthur residents. This historic \$3.5 billion investment triples the bulk billing incentive which is an immediate injection to support patients and GP's,
- Over 9200 Macarthur families will be better off under our Early Education package,
- Nearly 3000 Macarthur households will benefit from our Commonwealth Rental Assistance boost.
- 46,000 Macarthur residents will benefit from our pharmaceutical changes by introducing two-forone prescriptions, and
- 4000 Macarthur residents will benefit from investments in Paid Parental leave, Jobseeker and Austudy.
